This booklet and the information in the Y9 Choices Site has been created to guide you, the student, and your parents through the process of choosing the subjects you will study during Y10 & Y11


Before you go any further, make an agreement to commit to the full process outlined below and on the next page.

- Pick a subject just because you work well for that teacher. It may be a different teacher taking that subject in Y10/Y11
- Choose subjects just because your friends are choosing them
- Be afraid to choose subjects you have never studied before
- Ever forget to keep Thinking Big, Working Hard, and Being Kind



The decision to work towards qualifications above Level 2 is a personal choice.

The higher your level of education, the more opportunities will be available to you.

THE QUALIFICATION LEVELS

The subjects that you are selecting from are Level 2 courses.

A passing grade in four or more Level 2 courses usually opens up progression onto Level 3 courses.

(PGCE stands for the Post Graduate Certificate in Education. Every single one of your teachers has attained a Level 6 qualification, the vast majority have continued to Level 7 and some have even reached Level 8. Your teachers really know how to learn!)



Key Stage 4 students study the following "core" subjects at Hampstead School


These subjects form the foundation of your KS4 education.
